## How to Register for YMCA programs

See how to register for camp in camp section

1. **SAVE MONEY!** Save \$10 per session per child by registering and paying in full one week before your camp starts. (Gwinnett bus transportation not included.) Register early to guarantee your spot in a program.
2. A current program membership is required at the time of registration (program membership is \$35 for a year). We accept YMCA facility memberships for our programs.
3. Register on-line at [www.ymcadaycamping.com](http://www.ymcadaycamping.com). One per child needed for the program of your choice. You will need to submit the original completed registration forms with immunizations and if needed, a completed membership form.
4. In Person - Submit the original completed registration forms with immunizations and if needed, a completed membership form.
5. Submit with indicated payment **per session, per child**.
6. Submit with a \$25 **non-refundable** deposit **per session, per child**. The deposit is applied to the total camp fee and is used to reserve your spot up to one week prior to your start date. To avoid losing your deposit, full payment is due one week prior to the start of your chosen session.
7. Submit forms and payment via mail, walk in or fax 770-482-1514. If faxing, you must indicate Visa, American Express, Discover, MasterCard credit card number; expiration date; and, amount to be charged. Call to verify the fax was received.
8. See business hours and dates for walk-in registration.
9. Payment plans can be set up as early as March. In addition, you can arrange automatic charges to Visa, Discover, American Express, or MasterCard.
10. Once registered, deposits are refundable and transfer fees are waived until May 15, 2011.
11. When changing from one session to another or from one program to another there will be a transfer fee of \$10 per child/per change, assessed to your account after May 14, 2011.

**In order to remain registered and not lose your deposit the balance of session fees are due one week prior to the Friday your camp session begins. Once your camp begins, your deposit and tuition are forfeited, regardless of partial, full or no attendance.**

**Camp activities** promote teamwork, perseverance, respect, leadership, trust, patience and creativity. Safety and approved instructional methods are paramount. All campers are swim tested the first day of camp and swim daily with weather permitting. In a week's time your child will rotate with his/her group through a minimum of 15 activities (based on age, skill level and specialty camp choice) that may include any combination of the following:

## \*POST-CAMP CLUBS

Structured activity clubs will be offered between 4 - 6 p.m. Campers sign up daily at check-in for afternoon clubs. Most clubs are free of charge, except for those that call for pre-registration. See the list below.

**Saddle Club** \$40/week Saddle club is for those who want to spend more time with the horses and for those who just want to try an introduction to our horse program.

**Swim Lessons** \$70/for 2 weeks Swim Lessons are taught Monday - Thursday in a two-week period. Class times are 4:00 to 4:45 p.m., 4:45 to 5:30 p.m., 5:30 to 6:15 p.m., or 6:15 to 7:00 p.m. Now offering Saturday only, 8-week swim lessons.

**Tennis Club** Thanks to the Georgia Tennis Foundation Inc., campers who have never held a tennis racquet will have the opportunity on Tuesdays and Thursdays to try it out. Georgia Tennis Foundation Inc. loaned Bransby Outdoor YMCA 15 tennis racquets and balls for this club.



# CAMP CHOICES: TRADITIONAL OR THEME-BASED

A minimum of 14 participants are required for a theme camp. Otherwise, your child will be able to choose another theme camp of equal value with no transfer cost. We will keep your child busy.



**Eaglet Adventure Camp** Ages 5 - 6 \$135/week  
Campers spend their mornings on a different theme each week. In order of sessions, the eleven themes are wacky and wild week, out of this world, dinosaur days, water world, everyday heroes, American adventures, under the big top, music madness, around the world, the green earth, and character counts.

**Traditional Camp** Ages 7 - 16 \$135/week  
Campers are placed with 10 - 12 campers their own age in a co-ed huddle group. Groups spend the day in activities designed to teach new skills, increase self-confidence and build group unity. A great



program with the inexperienced camper in mind. We try to get

through a minimum of 15 different camp activities at least one time before the week is over.

Campers try a variety of activities in hopes of choosing a specialty camp on their next visit. Tennis and horseback riding not included as an activity. Campers swim every day (weather permitting).

## Choose Your Camp Theme

Each theme includes swimming every day, two hours of theme time and two hours of general camp activities

**Swim & Craft Camp** Ages 7 - 13 \$135/week  
Swim twice a day (weather permitting) and craft every day. Campers are divided by ages and are given the opportunity to explore the world of art through a variety of mediums.

**Boots & Saddle Horse Camp** Ages 6 - 13 \$145/week  
Campers are divided by age and skill level. Horse camp is a beginning-to intermediate-level activity designed for children with little or no previous riding experience. The goals of horse camp are to help each camper learn to be a safe, competent rider and to help campers learn to care for and work with the horses. Exhibitions are held each Friday for parents.

**Sports Sampler Camp** Ages 7 - 13 \$135/week  
Campers enjoy a week of sports, based on their choices from basketball to tennis as the primary sports choices. Drills and game play strategies are used.

**Super Size Camp** Ages 7 - 12 \$135/week  
Try playing a Frisbee golf game throwing a monster-size flying disc. Test your skills at volleyball, basketball, soccer using humongous balls. Then try your hand at these traditional fun games that are made for a gaint: Super Tumbling Timbers, Giant Four in a Row, Giant Chess, Jumbo Foam Dominos, Jumbo Checker/Backgammon, Jumbo Tic-Tac-Toe and Jumbo Ludo. **See schedule for week offerings**

**New Games Camp** Ages 7 - 12 \$135/week  
Try out three new games: trangleball, topperball and speedminton. Trangleball is a new game that requires running, passing, strategy, and teamwork. Try your skill at speedminton, a new racquet fun game. We also will introduce you to topperball, a batter's versus fielder's active fun game. Sure to be a cool spin on games you already know. **See schedule for week offerings**

**Circus Camp** Ages 7 - 12 \$135/week  
Juggle with balloons, sticks, bean bags, blocks, rings, clubs, balls and scarves. Make balloon animals, spin plates, tumble and perform for the Eaglets on Friday. **See schedule for week offerings**

## Camp New Heights Skill Development Camps

Travel daily to the J.M. Tull-Gwinnett YMCA located 14 miles from Bransby, for one of these skill development camps. Spend two hours in instructional learning and practice and three hours in traditional activities. Lunch is not included. (pizza and a drink on Friday is included) Bus leaves at 8:15 a.m. and returns at 4 p.m.

### Flag Football Camp\* Ages 7 - 12

Campers are given instruction in passing, teamwork, rules and technique. Drills and game play strategies are used.

### Soccer Camp\* Ages 7 - 12

Campers will spend daily two-hour block in instruction on passing, shooting, teamwork, rules and technique. Drills and game play strategies are used.

### Cheerleading Camp\* Ages 7 - 12

Campers are given the opportunity to learn cheers, songs, chants, low impact stunts, tumbling and teamwork.

### Golf Camp\* Ages 7 - 12

Campers spend time with a golf pro working on skill development, including choosing the proper equipment, putting and driving the golf ball.

### Diamond Sports\* Ages 7 - 12

Campers are split based on gender and given instruction on hitting, throwing, scoring, teamwork, rules and technique.

### Field Sports\* Ages 7 - 12

Campers are divided by ages and are given the opportunity to learn passing, scoring, teamwork, rules and technique in flag football and hockey.

### Court Sports\* Ages 7 - 12

Campers spend two hours on skills & drills in agility training, strokes, serves. Game play in volleyball and tennis.

## BRANSBY TEEN CAMPS Adventure & Leadership Camp

Ages 11 - 17 \$140/week

Teens "go for it" on our high adventure course. Participants will have the opportunity to transverse over a catwalk, walk along a tight rope wire grabbing grapevines to cross an invisible mote, take a leap towards a trapeze or swing on our giant swing. If time allows, zip away through the Bransby forest on a 100-foot zipline. For safety reasons everyone will be geared up with a harness and helmet, and participants will be required to be locked in on a safety device and static line before transversing from one element to the next.

### Play for Life Camp\* Ages 13 - 16

Spend time with a coach to learn how to use weightlifting equipment, try a class in aerobics or Pilates, learn to use our Fitlinxx program. Spend class time on nutrition, healthy habits and weight management. Afternoons are spent playing tennis, basketball and volleyball.

### Travel Camp\* Ages 11 - 14

Facility Member - \$160/week, per child  
Program Member - \$165/week, per child

Travel daily to the J.M. Tull-Gwinnett YMCA and join other teens on daily adventures around Atlanta. Bus leaves Bransby at 8:15 a.m. and returns at 4 p.m.

### Wrangler-in-Training (W.I.T) Ages 14- 18

\$145/week

Campers ages 14 and older will spend most of the day assisting barn staff with care and maintenance of horses, shadow teaching techniques of instructors hosting weekly horse shows and improving on their own riding skills with a daily riding lesson. Daily swim. End the week with a trail ride through Bransby forest on Friday.

### Night Owl Overnights Ages 6 - 14

\$35/child

Night Owls is an overnight program that will take place only one time this summer for each gender. Campers will spend daily activity time in developing and learning new skills with the goal to attend our one night sleep over and sleep under the stars. Program will include a late night swim, crafts, games, a cook out and a movie under the stars. You must be enrolled during the 2011 camp season to attend this event. This fee includes evening meal, late night snack, breakfast, and program supplies. Volunteer chaperones may sign-up no later than July 18, 2011. Sign up early. Chaperone spaces are available. All chaperones must complete proper paper work, including a background check, prior to the event. Minimum 10 participants required.

# AQUATICS

## Olympic-Size Swimming Pool

Our pool is open from May to October for weekend group rentals, and is open for Camp Bransby from late May through the second week of August and for YMCA swim lessons from June through August. Our pool is not open to the public. Swim lessons are based on enrollment and skills. Children will be placed in a group or with an instructor that best meets their swimming abilities. Due to enrollments, there may be a class with a child who has a different skill level. The instructor will advise parents when there is a better class time that meets the child's needs, or they will tailor their instruction individually to each participant. Once registered and the class has started, money cannot be refunded, except for medical reasons only. It is the parent's responsibility to know when the class they have registered for starts.

# THREE-TIER ADVENTURE PROGRAMS

## Level One: Low Ropes and Teambuilding

\$15/per member/half day \$20/per non-member/half day

### What is it?

A common theme among all action-learning programs is a solutions-focused team approach to problem solving, exploring effective communication techniques and building reliance and trust with each other. The experiential learning model is used as a base for curriculum support. The model calls for the following sequence: participating in an activity, debrief & reflection on participant's experience during the activity, and exploring how to transfer those learnings back to the participant's or team's real-life environment.

### Who is it for?

Great for families, multiple families, Girl Scouts/Boy Scouts groups, corporate groups, nonprofits, school groups, church groups and every group and team in our community will benefit from a minimum of a half-day trip through our low ropes challenge course. No skills required. There are four different low ropes challenge course areas, so after your first visit, come out for more days or more hours to give your team that ultimate challenge, to build on their communication skills, leadership styles, decision-making abilities, trust, and appropriate expression of feelings in a group situation. ## Level Two: Climbing Wall and Climbing Tower

\$80 per hour

Fun for the whole family, ages 6 and older can challenge themselves on our 25-foot helix climbing wall. Pick a day or sign up for multiple days. Minimum 5 participants required. Maximum 12 participants. Reserve your spot seven days in advance.

## Level Three: Challenge Tower

**Teen/Adult High Adventure Days** \$18/per member/half day - \$20/per non-member/half day

Teens "go for it" on our high adventure days. Adults are welcome to sign up. You must be entering sixth grade or be 12 years old to take on the high adventure tower. Participants will have the opportunity to transverse over a catwalk, walk along grabbing grapevines to cross an invisible mote, take a leap towards a trapeze or swing on a giant swing. If time allows, zip through the Bransby forest on our 100-foot zipline. For safety reasons, everyone will be geared up with a harness and helmet, and participants will be required to be locked in on a safety device and static line before transversing from one element to the next. ## Sports Programs

### Tennis Lessons (ages 6 - adult)

**Fee:** \$45 per child, \$50 per adult  
(includes four lessons)

Coach Taylor comes to us with 20 years experience on the tennis court both playing and teaching to a variety of ages. Coach Taylor teaches tennis through traditional drills and skills and eye and hand coordination play.
